

NFI & ES Sector Monthly Update #6

DARFUR
June 2008

Executive Summary

- In June, **32,701 households were served with non-food items (NFIs)** from the NFI Common Pipeline in Darfur, to whom 98,429 items were distributed. 129,515 households have been supported in the first half of 2008 with a total of 784,510 items.
- UNJLC, as the Sector Lead for the Non-Food Item (NFI) and Emergency Shelter (ES) Sector, advocated for and secured US\$646,000 in the 2008 2nd Allocation of the Common Humanitarian Fund (CHF) for Sector activities. Allocation to Sector partners has been finalized on a no-objection basis. Details are shown in the Current NFI & ES Sector Funding Status chart.
- The NFI Common Pipeline was separately allocated US\$1.625 million from the 2nd CHF Allocation, specifically dedicated to procurement of life-saving NFI stocks for the Darfur and Rest of North Sudan regions.

Sector Overview

Funding Update

The 2008 2nd Allocation of the Common Humanitarian Fund took place in June. UNJLC advocated on behalf of the Non-Food Item (NFI) and Emergency Shelter (ES) Sector and secured US\$646,000 for the Darfur region activities. Sector partners agreed, during a special coordination meeting, on the following priorities for allocation: time critical intervention, funding needs (organizations that are relatively more under-funded than others), support of under-served areas, coordination of Sector and management of the NFI Common Pipeline, and organizations with the capacity to implement. All partners were provided the opportunity to request funds for their specific projects. UNJLC, as Sector Lead, received all requests and proposed an allocation of the funds, which was accepted on a no-objection basis. The Current NFI & ES Sector Funding Status chart details the results of this round, along with all other known secured funding.

Separately, the NFI Common Pipeline was allocated US\$1.625 million from the 2nd CHF Allocation, specifically dedicated to the procurement of vital non-food item stocks for the Darfur and Rest of North Sudan regions combined. The procurement process has already been initiated against these funds.

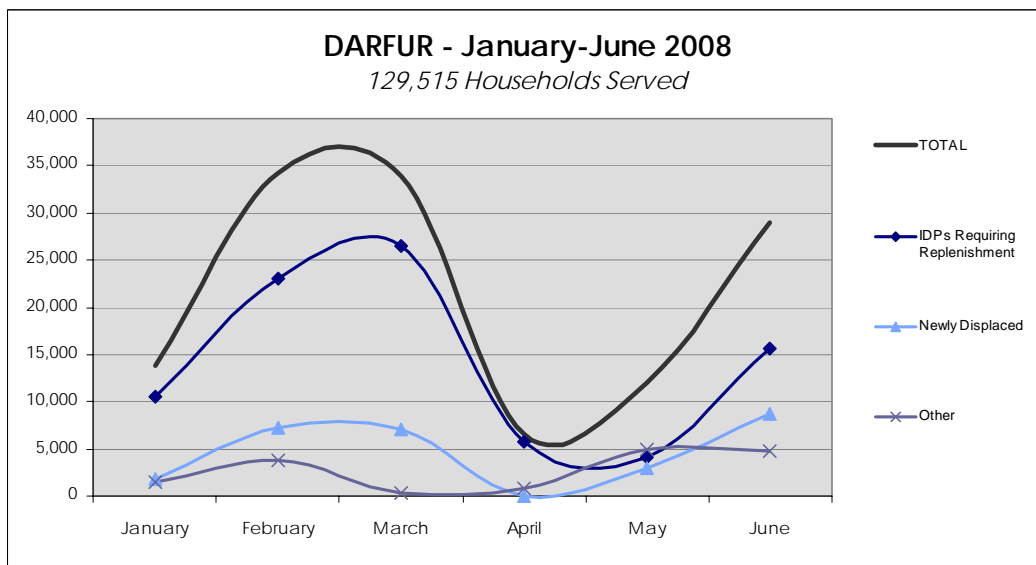

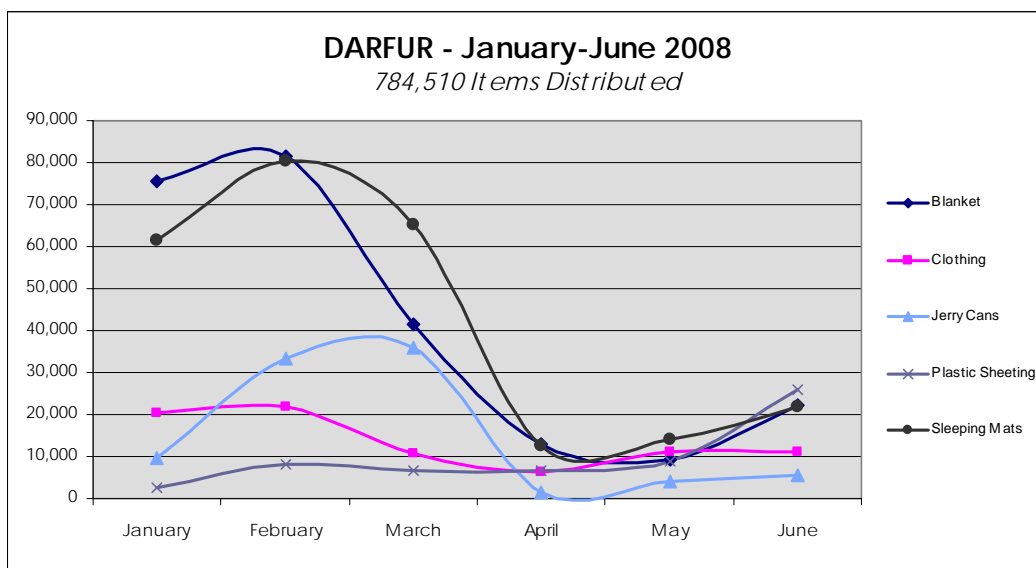

NFI Common Pipeline

January – June 2008 Distribution Trends



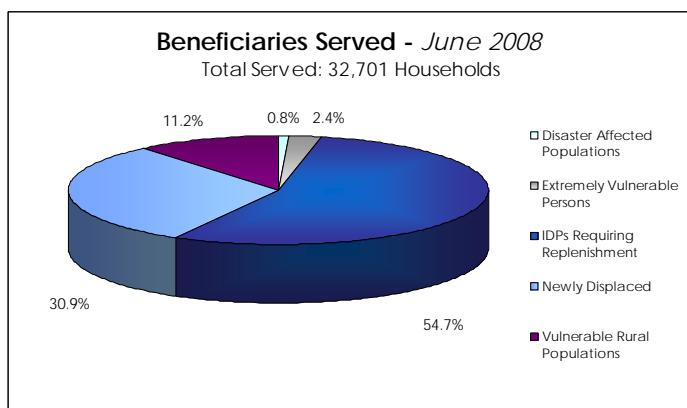
Common Pipeline NFIs were distributed to 129,515 households in the first half of 2008, of which IDPs requiring replenishment and newly displaced populations were the largest beneficiary groups. Other beneficiaries supported were 1,238 disaster-affected households, 3,900 households of extremely vulnerable persons, 4,018 households of organized returns, 3,445 households of populations not previously served, and 3,668 households of vulnerable rural populations. Targeted replenishment activities reflect the changes in seasons – showing peaks in the early part of the year for the end of cold season activities and a rise in May and June for pre-rainy season activities.



In the first half of 2008, 784,510 were distributed, of which 244,532 were blankets and 257,144 were plastic sleeping mats. These two items peaked in the first few months of 2008, as targeted replenishments continued to focus on meeting the needs of the cold season. Plastic sheeting distributions rose in May and June, as distributions began to focus more on preparing for the up-coming rains.

June Activities

In June, 32,701 households were supported with non-food items from the NFI Common Pipeline in Darfur, for which IDPs requiring replenishment and newly displaced populations were the two largest beneficiary groups supported. To these households, 98,429 items were distributed, including 23,729 blankets, 7,972 jerry cans, 27,291 pieces of plastic sheeting, 424 pieces of sanitary material, 23,305 plastic sleeping mats, 3,645 pieces of soap, and 12,063 pieces of women's clothing.

The recent allocation from the Common Humanitarian Fund of US\$1.625 million will enable the Common Pipeline Partners to initiate the procurement process for other standard items.
